Safeguarding

We are committed to ensuring every child in school is safe and happy. If you are concerned that any child may be in danger, being abused or being neglected, please contact Mr Brown or Mrs Crawshaw, our Designated Safeguarding Officers at school, in confidence, so we can ensure action is taken to keep every child safe.

Special Educational Needs

If you have concerns or questions about your child, or would like support, please arrange a meeting with your child's **class teacher**. They will listen to and record your concerns as well as giving feedback on their experience of your child in class. Some initial strategies and help will be implemented and after a short time your child's progress will be reviewed.

If, after the initial monitoring period, we feel that your child does have special educational needs (SEN), we will place them on the SEN register. Mr Brown is our SENCCo and he will work with you to make sure the best support is given.

If we feel that it might be beneficial to seek support from an outside agency (e.g. Speech and Language Therapy, Child and Adolescent Mental Health Service or Occupational Therapy), we will make a referral. This will be done with agreement from yourselves and involves completing forms detailing our concerns with supporting evidence (such as examples of particular behaviours or emotional needs).

Reading

Reading is the key to your child's learning and it is essential for children to develop good reading habits and a love for reading to help with all their other subjects in school. Please read with your child every night and ask them questions about what has been read. Questions such as how characters are feeling, what do they think will happen next, where is this story set etc. will really help your child engage with the text.
