

Attendance

You have a legal duty to ensure your child attends school every day on time. Punctuality is very important and not a single minute of learning time should be missed. All of our children are engaged in their learning from the minute they arrive in school. Children can fall behind quickly if they miss these vital learning minutes.



Reception, year 1 and 2 start at 8:50am and finish at 3:15pm.

Years 3, 4, 5 and 6 start at 8:55am and finish at 3:20pm.

Behaviour (absolutes)

Every child must follow our absolutes which includes showing good behaviour in the classroom, outside and around the academy. When you arrive

Miss Bullock, Mrs Crawshaw and Mr Brown are available on the playground in the morning at drop off and at home time. If you need to pass on any information to the class teacher, please speak to these adults. Teachers are busy getting the children into class for learning each morning, it's important that we do not disturb learning. We always pass on all messages as quickly as possible.

Please make sure you do not leave children unsupervised on the yard in the morning, always make sure a member of staff is there.

Homework



Doing your homework and keeping your planner up to date is another behaviour absolute and so is regular reading.

Reading is the key to your child's learning and it is essential for children to develop good reading habits and a love for reading to help with all their other subjects in school. Please read with your child every night and ask them questions about what has been read.

Respect

We teach all children to be respectful and polite to all adults in and around school and all children too. We expect all children, staff and visitors to treat everyone as they would expect to be treated themselves. We thank you for your support with this.
