Earlier this week, our Y5 parents/carers were sent a letter and admissions guide for their child's transition to secondary school.

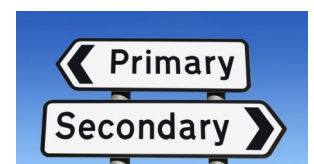
The letter provided information about applications to grammar school, as well as extra criteria needed for other secondary schools.

Earthshot Eco Committee

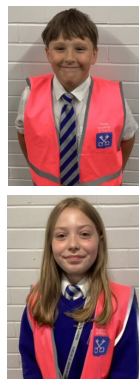
